SHATTERING STEREOTYPES: IMAGES OF THE OTHER

and

PORTRAITS OF MUSLIMS AND ARABS IN POPULAR CULTURE

Dr. Jack G. Shaheen, **CBS News Consultant**, multi-cultural educator and Fulbright Scholar, is internationally known for his ardent ability to address the impact of media images on racial and ethnic groups. He exposes stereotypical images of cultural others, candidly explaining **why** portraits permeate psyches and presenting possible **solutions** to the problem.

He is warmly received by students at universities and private schools throughout the world. Among them: Harvard, Amherst, Oxford, Georgetown, the University of Toronto, the American University of Beirut, Northwestern, Knox, Emory, the University of Southern California, the University of California at Los Angeles, Germantown Academy, Exeter and Washington University.

He speaks to and consults with numerous professional organizations. Among them: The United Nations, New York Commission on Human Rights, Illinois Humanities Council, County of Los Angeles Committee on Human Relations, Philadelphia's Balch Institute for Ethnic Studies, Young President's Organization, the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, the International Policy Institute, the National Association of Editorial Cartoonists and the United Auto Workers of America.

Shaheen's multi-cultural essays appear in numerous academic journals and textbooks: Image Ethics, Celebrating Diversity and New Worlds of Literature. His 300-plus essays appear in national and international magazines and newspapers such as Newsweek, The Los Angeles Times, The Wall Street Journal, and The Washington Post.

In Los Angeles he worked with several television series: The Lucy Show, Twelve O'Clock High and The Undersea World of Jacques Cousteau. In the St. Louis area, he served as KPLR-TV's Film-Theater critic, wrote a weekly TV column for the Metro-East Journal and currently hosts the Higher Education Channel's **What Have We Learned** series.

A recipient of two Fulbright teaching awards, Shaheen is the author of Nuclear War Films and the award-winning book, The TV Arab. He is a frequent guest on network programs: Nightline, Today, Good Morning America, CBS This Morning, 48 Hours, Voice of America, and Larry King and Michael Jackson's syndicated radio shows.

Currently, he is at work on two books: The Hollywood Arab and The Comic Book Arab.
