Dear Nolan,

For those of us who have long worked in progressive media and on promoting alternative visions, the country seems suddenly to have stepped through the looking glass. Intolerance and attacks on civil liberties and freedom of expression are pervasive. There is alarming public cynicism about government. Long accepted notions of pluralism and civic life are under fierce threat.

Contributing to the present situation is a global media system that has little to do with the responsibilities of a free press in a democratic society. Today, solid journalism is being overwhelmed by entertainment and tabloidization in the new information marketplace, as the role of the citizen is being displaced by that of the consumer.

Current trends in the mass media often foster reactionary points of view and marginalize — or render non-existent — independent and diverse voices. Many Americans are unsure about how to react to the increasing media coverage and legitimization of right wing groups that challenge not just the role of government, but the foundations of public life.

In the response to the current media and political climate, leaders from independent print, radio, television, video, and online services, led by the Institute for Alternative Journalism, have been exploring ways of collaboratively building a stronger independent media system. This diverse group of media activists is also grappling with the success of the right wing in framing issues in the mainstream media and in building a powerful media infrastructure of its own.

It is clear that no matter how we define the present problem — the narrowing range of voices and opinions, the destabilizing effect of the media's obsession with extremes, the capacity of right wing media to shape and distort debate, the further concentration of ownership and control of information outlets — new methods of building a more synergistic independent media and reaching a wider audience must be found.

Planning is now underway for an unprecedented Media & Democracy Congress, slated for February 29-March 3, 1996 in San Francisco. The overarching goal of the conference is to prepare for the public media of the 21st century.
